SEVIER COUNTY FAIR GOAT SHOW

This is an open, fun show for both children and adults raising goats. Goats must be either female, or wethers, NO BUCKS please. Horned and dehorned goats are allowed in a fun show. Goats do not need to be registered to participate in this show, and all breeds are welcome.

All goats must be accompanied by health papers, scrapie ear tag and have an identifying tag or tattoo so that show officials can check their papers on arrival to the fairgrounds. If goats are tattooed, the tattoos must be legible. NO SICK GOATS will be allowed on the premises.

Entry fees are \$2.00 per goat. All entries are encouraged to be received by August 28, 2009. Pre entry registration is encouraged however we will accept late day of show entries.

Premiums and ribbons will be awarded in each class for 5 places, participation ribbons for additional entries Trophy will be awarded for first in each of four categories. a \$25.00 award and trophy will be presented to the overall or Best Goat in show.

Premiums :

1st - \$10.00 2nd - \$8.00 3rd - \$7.00 4th - \$5.00 5th - \$4.00 6th - \$2.00

All goats must be entered in the individual classes to participate in the group classes and costume class. Goats are expected to wear a collar and be escorted by their owner/agent into the show ring.

Individuals showing dairy type goats will be expected to show wearing white jeans, trousers, white shirts and white shoes. All other breeds may wear black jeans/trousers and white shirts. No open toed shoes should be worn in the show ring.

NEW We will have a Children's Class beginning at 6PM -Children under the age of 10 may show their goats(any breed). Goats must be shown in ring. Can have any type lead. Showmanship class.(participations ribbons given to each entry)

Base date is show date.

The four groups for show will be:

- Meat type goats
- Pygmy
- Oberhasli specialty(NEW)
- Dairy type goats

THE CLASSES FOR THE MEAT AND PYGMY GOATS ARE:

1. 0-4 months
2. 5 months – 8 months
3. Yearling (8 months -12 months)
4. 2 – 3 year old
5. 3 – 5 year old
6. Aged animals
